It is famous for its zigzag layers of white siliceous rock which stands out through the tilted and flat rock. The sea there is also very clean, so you can see the hefty white chunks of washed-up coral and some marine animals in the lovely blue sea. Standing near the mirror-like water surface, you can feel the sea breeze. I recommend you to use both close-up shots and wide shots. Close-up shots are for you to capture the little sea creatures, and the wide shot is for capturing the spectacular hexagonal columns and water splashing onto the rocks.
