


#### DODGEBALL COMPETITION

### Cambridge Model United Nations

From January 30 to February 4, 14 F.3 to F.5 Jubileans participated in the Cambridge Model United Nations, joining nearly 300 students worldwide. This year's theme, "Rethinking Global Solidarity: Including the Excluded," sparked engaging discussions as delegates from various countries tackled real-world challenges.

The event began with an inspiring lecture by Mo Tanweer from the University of Cambridge. Jubileans represented different nations, actively debating, proposing motions, and formulating draft resolutions, enhancing their understanding of international relations. Notably, Clarice Yeung from 4D received an Honourable Mention in the Commission on the Status of Women.

Additionally, they explored British culture through punting in Cambridge and a day tour in London. This transformative experience has left a lasting impact on all participants.



# Taiwan Tourism & Hospitality Study Tour

From April 13 to 17, 30 students from our school studying Tourism and Hospitality and Geography participated in a five-day study tour to Taipei, guided by three teachers. This trip included cultural experiences, nature exploration, and academic exchanges, allowing students to gain a deeper understanding of Taiwan's tourism industry and cultural characteristics, while integrating classroom knowledge with practical observations.

On the first day, students visited Shifen Old Street, experiencing the charm of traditional sky lantern culture and writing their wishes to bless their upcoming DSE exams. The next day, they traveled to Beitou Geothermal Valley to observe the unique geothermal landscape and learn about Taiwan's rich natural resources. Additionally, students engaged with tourism students from a local university to discuss the similarities and differences in tourism education between the two regions, while also experiencing campus life in Taiwan to broaden their horizons.

On the final day, the study group visited the bustling Ximending area to analyze the business models and development of the cultural and creative industries in that region. Through on-site observation, students gained a deeper understanding of the tourism industry's impact on the local economy.

### Taiwan Servicelearning Trip

At Taiwan Indigenous Peoples Cultural Park, we decoded the stories behind traditional clothing and witnessed vibrant performances that brought Indigenous culture to life.

On May 15, two F.4 groups explored Cheung Chau's coast. They also investigated Tung Wan Beach, studying human impact and measuring waves. This trip deepened their understanding of coastal ecosystems and environmental care.

On May 10, F.5 Geography students conducted fieldwork in San Po Kong on "The Transformation of San Po Kong Industrial Area." Led by mentors from Caritas Chan Chun Ha Field Studies Center, they assessed building ages and mapped land use changes.
